Many steps have been taken to expand and improve the lines of communication: For What It's Worth, the Alpine Informer, Facebook, and the Community Chat. All of these sources are accessible with internet access, and a print copy of FWIW is available in the Lodge lobby. Our GM holds a monthly forum for property owner discussion. Topics, if applicable, come to the Board for discussion and action.

Agenda items may be recommended through Community Chat, and Members may attend any scheduled Open Meeting or Workshop. Property owners can also join meetings and workshops remotely through Go-To-Meeting. Information on how to log in is posted before each meeting. The Board also makes every effort to approve and post minutes in a timely manner, and all minutes remain accessible through the Members section of our website.

You can take advantage of all these sources of information to stay informed. Please rely on attendance at meetings, review of minutes, and communication from the Board or management to obtain accurate information.

At times, Property Owners may feel the need to express their concern regarding specific issues. Please share your comments appropriately. The website suggestion box can be used to forward comments to the correct person who is in a position to address your situation. If the matter relates to policy, the Board can address and clarify; and if the matter relates to operations and personnel, do not address it directly with employees, but notify the General Manager as the proper chain of communication.

Work is ongoing with Beitzel Corporation and Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc. who engineered the replacement of approximately 1200 feet of sewer main located between the beach and boathouse. This area is in disrepair and a large source of Inflow & Infiltration to our sewer plant. Work began at the site after Labor Day and has since been delayed several times due to weather related issues. We appreciate your patience as we are diligently working to progress and complete this project.

Customers were mailed information on Preston County's Wireless Emergency Notification System (WENS). This is a system ALPUC plans to utilize to communicate information to our customers such as Boil water notices, Leaks and other information that would be helpful to our customers. If you have any questions on the form, please do not hesitate to contact our office (304)789-6996. You can drop off, mail or email alpucoffice@frontier.com your completed form. Once the information is received and we are set up in their system, we will perform a "test" notification to announce that it is up and running.

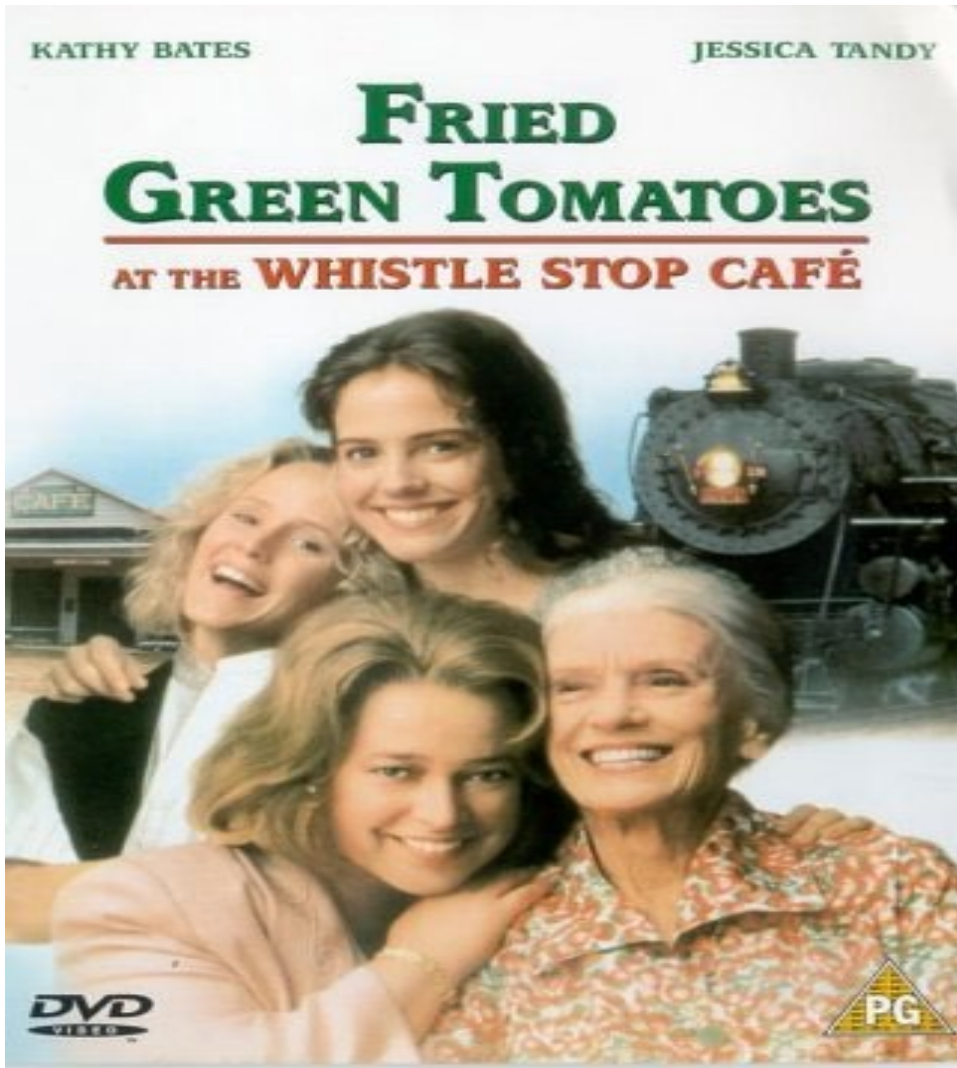
