ALPINE LAKE HOMEOWNERS SHOWCASE PROPERTY by *Kathy Andes*

The Annual Alpine Lake Home Tour is just around the corner from 1-5pm on Sunday, June 25th. Five homeowners will open their homes to showcase ideas for retirement, leisure and vacation living. (See last pages for more info.)

“Chestnut Corner,” the spacious, updated home of Jim and Norleen Hoadley is a great example of a home in its natural setting where one can quietly sit and listen to the sound of rustling trees. The front wall of windows provides a year-round view of beautiful Alpine Lake. Their recently updated garage provides ample space for one of Jim’s favorite hobbies, home brewing beer. Furnishings are meaningful pieces from every part of the Hoadleys’ lives and reflect the colors of the sylvan surroundings.

Rick and Nancy Henderson’s home, “Double the Pleasure” was originally built in 1976 as a one story, three bedroom, one bath cabin. A second floor and two additional bathrooms were added to the southern farm-like home in 2009. Their wooded lot, left in its natural state, creates a nice woodsy feel to their home.

“Ohana,” the name of Michael and Bridget Kistler’s home, is the Hawaiian name for family, which includes all of those with whom you share the most important parts of your life. According to the Kistlers, the home’s simple nature conceals the true beauty of what the home has to offer. The two story wall of windows provides a stunning view of both Alpine Lake and the mountains. The owners feel that the great room is a wonderful area to make memories; whether one is nestled in front of the fireplace, or enjoying each other’s company at the breakfast bar and open kitchen.

Gazing up into the trees above the winding driveway, visitors to Jay and Sue Beigel’s home get the feel of being in their aptly named “Tree House.” The mid 1990s saw the beginning of a series of makeovers to the original 1976 modular home. Updates include cedar siding, two expansive decks, multiple skylights, new flooring and antiques kitchen cabinets. The Austrian chalet-like home is decorated with bears and birdhouses, family heirlooms and collectibles, as well a variety of “wildlife trophies” from West Virginia, Vermont and Alaska.

The amazing view of the magnificent Alpine Lake can be enjoyed during the tranquil, morning hours through the grand bank of windows that look out upon the north end of the lake. “Windows,” the home of James and Barbra Herndon, was built by Homes for All Seasons in 1995. The multilevel home features a guest loft, a main living level that includes an open kitchen, great room and a bright, cheery sunroom. The Herndon home is decorated with an eclectic mix of furniture, decorations, works of art and wall hangings. The backyard deck provides a woodsy setting coupled with the sound of a small babbling stream that runs through the front and back lots.

Field Trip: High Mountain Creamery and Market Tour and Luncheon (DONE)
