SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Draft Policy: July 2017

BACKGROUND

The Alpine Lake Property Owners Association hosts multiple social media venues for posting and sharing information. Our public page, Alpine Lake Resort, shares information of general interest to the surrounding area, and of interest to people at large who seek to learn more about our community, amenities, and events. The Alpine Lake Property Owners Association, Inc. Facebook page is a closed group, used by property owners to exchange information and comment on the general state of matters within and around the community. Members may post additional items believed to be of interest to the group. It tends to be the most "social" of the social media sites. The third group is the Community Chat portion of our webpage, which is accessed through a member name/password procedure. This is the site where property owners can chat with each other for recommendations or advice on specific matters, share items of interest, or ask specific questions and raise concerns related to policies and procedures of our community.

CONCERN

The introduction to the invitation to join the Community Chat includes a statement regarding a civil exchange of ideas. As a result of questionable posts on that Chat, a policy was approved regarding removal of postings that are considered personal attacks, hurtful and/or offensive. Unfortunately, posts perceived to contain questionable information, angry comments, or negative opinions have appeared in all three of our social media venues, prompting a review of the existing social media policy, and a revision of the policy to address these additional concerns.

REVISED POLICY

1. Any post, which includes vulgar, profane, or offensive language, will be immediately removed without the requirement of a review.
2. Any post that contains defamation of another person will be immediately removed without the requirement of a review.
3. Any member of the Alpine Lake Property Owners Association can request the review of a posting on any of our social media venues.
 - a. The request should be sent to the General Manager, or designee, via the appropriate email address.
 - b. The GM, or designee, will poll the Alpine Lake Webmaster and the Alpine Lake board liaison.
 - c. If two of the three agree that there is ample reason to remove the posting, the post will be removed in a timely manner.
 - d. The author of the deleted post will be notified of the reason for its deletion.
4. The author of any deleted posting may appeal the decision to the Board of Directors.
5. The contents of this policy will be included in the Property Owners Handbook and posted to the Alpine Lake Property Owners Association, Inc. page and to Community Chat.
6. Any property owner whose posts elicit an excessive number of removals will be considered for read only permissions (can view, but not contribute) or exclusion from the group.
7. This policy will apply to all current and future social media venues that are administered by the Alpine Lake Property Owners Association, Inc.

Field Trip: High Mountain Creamery and Market Tour and Luncheon (DONE)

Monday, June 19, meet at 10am at the Lodge parking lot to carpool

HCC is located in Grantsville, Maryland and is a local artisan cow cheese facility. The plant has a large viewing window to observe the cheese-making process. Lunch will be provided at the Farmer's Table restaurant with locally sourced farm-to-table products as available. It's about an hour north at 97 Locker Lane, Grantsville, MD.

Workshop: Dancing Like a Star with Tom Kinsey and Merrie Lee Roller (DONE)

Tuesday, July 11th, 3:30pm in the Evergreene Room at the Lodge– Class is limited to 10 pairs (one leader/one designated follower) (DONE)

This workshop is an introduction to basic East Coast Swing Dancing. If there is enough interest, the introductory session will be repeated the same day at 7:30 p.m. Follow-up classes may be scheduled in the fall. Friendly, non-judgmental environment. Skills needed: know your left foot from your right foot and be able to count to six. At the end of the 90 minute session, you will be able to dance the basic six-count swing dance step and you will know at least two moves out of the basic step. Registration will be in pairs. You will switch partners.

Instructor's Background: Merrie Lee Roller has been Tom's dance partner for the last four years, her only dance lessons have been with Tom (she feels your pain). Since about 2000, Tom has taken a series of swing dance lessons from private instructors and from community/club programs in the Pittsburgh area. He estimated that he took Introductory East Coast Swing lessons 4 times...so he knows the hurdles. Bottom line come join this fun couple...and dance to the music!
