Trees available are: White Pine, scotch pine, Norway spruce, white oak, red oak, chestnut oak, sawtooth oak, black walnut, butternut, shagbark hickory, Chinese chestnut, American chestnut, Allegheny chinquapin, sugar maple, river birch, tulip poplar, black cherry, flowering dogwood, silky dogwood, redbud, sycamore, and black locust. 
